June's Farmer's Market
 CCBA Honey Booth Cancelled

The Franklin County Farmer's Market is beginning walk-up customers but only on Tuesday's. According to the May 21st email sent to vendors from Market Manager Michelle Bragg, "Through June, Tuesdays will be the only day for walk-up customers to attend as Thursdays and Saturdays will continue to be by pre-order/pick-up only."

As a rotating vendor, the CCBA operates the "Honey Booth" offering local honey and other hive products, i.e. candles, on the Second Saturday of each month. Therefore, the Association will not be able to sell due to the persistent Covid-19 restriction's.

It is then hopeful that in July that the booth may be

able to open but there will be Department of Agriculture restrictions and policies to adhere to. Masks and gloves will have to be worn by vendors, social distancing



will be in place for vendors and visitors, no samples can be offered, and more. The following link was included in Michelle's email of the requirements for those participating. Capital City Beekeepers Association Meeting Minutes of 28 April 2020

<u>NOTE</u>: Due to the Coronid-19 outbreak, the meeting was conducted by means of video-conferencing through Zoom thanks to Adam Leonberger of the Franklin County Cooperative Extension.

Program:

Jack Kuhn and Wes Henry did a live Facebook broadcast at 6:30 p.m. in which they inspected our two Langstroth hives.

Meeting:

President Wes Henry called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. He called for the approval of the March meeting minutes, as printed in the newsletter. There were no comments, this then taken as an approval. The same held true for the financial report as presented by treasurer, George Fowler.

Activity Reports:

Swarm Report:

As we enter the peak time for swarm reports, several members have reported capturing swarms. The association did receive three calls regarding swarms to which members responded. One swarm is living in a tree that the owner did not want removed, so the swarm/hive stays.

Library Report:

Librarian George Fowler reported that the library is secure and that he was looking at it in his home as he spoke.

Old Business:

Volunteer Door Prize Program:

The volunteer prize drawing for June has been cancelled.

With Dadant & Sons Package Day moved up on relatively short notice and then our participation cancelled, the secretary proposed that those volunteers who had signed up should have their names 'put in the hat' for volunteering. Ken Daniels seconded the motion. One objection was expressed when the motion was brought forward for approval. The basis of the objection was that during the present circumstances beyond anyone's control many things have been cancelled and, although regrettable, that's the way things were. George made a motion to table the discussion for the time being. Jack Kuhn seconded the motion and the motion to table was approved.

Shirts:
