

* **Guest Speaker**: Dr. Tom Webster from Kentucky State University spoke on Nosema in our bee hives. He also touched on what we should be doing this time of year. He recommends feeding your bees to encourage queen laying and brood build up. He also spoke on: importance of pollen collection; being careful about where you get your queens when you need to requeen; mite resistance; checking for mites; Georgia Extension Agent's At Home Beekeeping Series (online series); and Heartland Apiculture Society meeting Thurs June 28-Fri July 1, 2022.

*Business meeting: began at 7:2 0pm. January minutes were approved.

***Treasurer's Report**: Was given by George Fowler. Current balance is \$2477.00. Treasurer's report was approved.
